







<u>Materials</u>

- 1. One Spin and Draw worksheet for every student
- 2. One Money Spinner worksheet for every two students
- 3. One large paper clip to accompany every spinner worksheet
- 4. A sharpened pencil for every student
- 5. (Optional) Silver and copper or gray and brown crayons for every student

<u>How to Play</u>

Spin the paper clip spinner on the Money Spinner worksheet. Look at the coin that the spinner landed on. On the Spin and Draw worksheet, draw a picture of the coin on the line next to its value. Take turns spinning and drawing with a partner. (Don't write down anything that your partner spins.) The first person to spin and draw five of the same coin and reach the finish line wins!

<u>How to Spin</u>

- 1. Place one paper clip over the gray circle that is in the center of the spinner worksheet. The gray circle should be visible through the middle of the tip.
- 2. Put the point of a sharpened pencil inside the tip of the paper clip.
- 3. Flick the paper clip as you would flick a standard spinner. Before playing, practice spinning to make the spinner go at least one full circle.
